Summary Information

Bodmin College

A 4 day summer school was offered to all rising Year 7 students, from Tuesday 31st August to Friday 3rd September 2021. All students were sent a direct invitation via parent email and primary schools were asked to share the information with more vulnerable students including PP, SEND and CiC. The summer school aimed to support students with the transition from primary to secondary school, and to aid educational recovery following COVID-19, focusing mostly on student wellbeing. The summer school curriculum comprised lessons in English, Maths, Science, French and Humanities as well as lessons in Sports, Team Building, Animal Care and Outdoor Education. Students were allocated to groups based on their year 7 tutor groups, had a briefing at the beginning of the week and a celebration event at the end of the week. Lunch was provided and eaten by students together each day.






Feedback

Impact Analysis/Next Steps

- The summer school programme was successful and achieved its aims of supporting Y7 transition both academically and in terms of wellbeing.
- The curriculum was varied and successfully captured students' imaginations, whilst also providing them with a sound introduction to our routines and expectations.
- Having break and lunch together, the awards ceremony at the end of the week and celebrating the upcoming visit of the Tour
 of Britain to Bodmin, helped to create a strong sense of community and ensured that the students left with a feeling of belonging
 and a clear understanding of the Bodmin Values.
- If finances permit, there is a strong argument for repeating the summer school in summer 2022. The structure of the day worked well and could be replicated without change.
- Attendance at the summer school may be higher if the dates were published to rising Year 7 parents earlier. The summer school date placement at the end of the summer holidays created a nice transition for the students starting the following week.
