OVERVIEW

ACADEMIC STUDY

At Bodmin College the curriculum is designed to provide a broad education and to give students the opportunity to achieve their potential. We promote the highest expectations of our students and the quality teaching and learning across the college is at the core of everything we do. The high standard of teaching across the school is tailored to students' needs and we are proud that our students enjoy their time at school working with such passionate staff. Our students are taught using a range of techniques but all are taught to develop independent thinking skills to enable them to continue learning outside of the classroom.

The College has a calm and relaxed environment with students engaged in their learning. Lessons are differentiated to the needs of the students and there is a rigorous and relentless drive to maintain high standards.

PASTORAL CARE AND GUIDANCE

Our system of care and guidance is well considered and effective, involving every member of staff. We work very closely with our local primary schools to ensure the move to College is as successful and welcoming as possible. Whether in person, or virtually, we offer a friendly, open invitation to all prospective students to experience the supportive and nurturing environment at Bodmin College. An extensive induction programme with their tutor ensures your child has a smooth and welcoming transition from primary to secondary school.

In Year 7 your child will be placed in a Tutor Group which takes account of primary school friendships, skills and backgrounds bringing together children with a range of abilities including those from the Greenfield Centre. The group is under the guidance of a Form Tutor and will remain together until Year 11, when they will join a team of specialist tutors who will support their transition to the post-16 stage of their education.

HISTORY

Bodmin College was first opened in 1973 following the closure of the Bodmin Grammar School, often known as Harleigh School. Bodmin College is larger than the average-sized secondary school and on January 1, 2011, the College became one of the first Academies in the county. Bodmin College has approximately 1300 students in Key Stages 3 and 4 with another 330 in the Sixth Form. In addition, the College has an Area Resource Base (The Greenfield Centre) which accommodates 40 children with multiple and profound Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND). Further to this, Bodmin College has developed a Centre for Vocational Excellence at the Woods Browning Industrial Estate

located nearby and delivers a range of vocational courses, apprenticeships for the local community and, in partnership with Falmouth University, a purpose-built facility enabling the delivery of Degreelevel courses in Digital Media. Whilst striving for academic excellence, Bodmin College provides high quality support for all students encouraging every child to achieve success and be aspirational in the pursuit of reaching their personal potential.





HISTORY

Over the last decade significant improvements have been made to the premises with a continuous programme of new building and refurbishment. The main College site now comprises of seven main buildings, with additional accommodation at Woods Browning Vocational Training Centre.

Following the development and extension of the Sixth Form Centre the requirement for additional catering facilities led to the development of The Crate Café for 6th Form students. This development was supported with a Hub Box kiosk and new facilities for students in Years 7 – 11 as well as a move to a cashless payment system.

Lessons are taught in specialist rooms throughout the College with students having access to high-quality resources in all subject areas. For example, the Studio is a multifunctional area in the Creativity Building with custom built teaching studios, rehearsal/practice rooms and the latest sound, lighting and recording facilities.

With the refurbishment of five science laboratories and three technology rooms in 2016 and the addition of the new Beacon Block of classrooms in 2018, Bodmin College boasts some of the best facilities for education in the county. Further to these facilities are our Sports Hall and Academy Gym where students can engage in sporting or recreational activities under the supervision of specialist teachers and coaches. We are pleased to have the Greenfield Centre in the Bell Building which provides for children in North Cornwall who have multiple and severe learning difficulties. Students from within Greenfield attend, where possible, mainstream lessons and tutor time. The recently refurbished facility is within the main building and includes a range of specialist classrooms facilities access, including the Hideout, a purposebuild multi-sensory room. Greenfield students also integrate across the college contributing to a genuine community atmosphere. A new Pathways facility allows Greenfield students to continue their Bodmin College education right into sixth form and beyond.

In addition to the facilities on the main campus, the College has acquired and refurbished several industrial units on the Woods Browning Industrial Estate. These facilities have allowed us to develop a broad curriculum designed to meet the wider needs and aspirations of our students, providing pathways to excellent employment opportunities. The wonderful facilities and ability to offer such an extensive and inclusive curriculum is something of which we are very proud.

The College campus is available to community groups, societies and clubs (cultural, sporting, recreational and charitable) who frequently use our premises and facilities for a variety of purposes. A wide range of extra-curricular and community activities adds considerably to the quality of life in the College and to that of the town.

OUR CURRICULUM

Key Stage 3

During Years 7 and 8 we provide a broad and balanced curriculum of core and foundation subjects, which includes:

Core Subjects

- English
- Mathematics
- Science

Foundation Subjects

- Humanities (Geography and History)
- Modern Foreign Language (French)
- Creative Design & Food (Subjects are Food, Fashion & Textiles, Engineering and Graphic Design)
- Information Technology
- Creativity (Art, Music and Drama)
- Religious Education and PSHE/RSE Citizenship
- Physical Education

Year 8 is characterised by Options. This process is the first stage in developing a curriculum increasingly personalised to the needs and aspirations of the individual. Whilst the process varies slightly each year, the main purpose is to choose a number of Foundation Subjects to continue to study in more depth throughout Years 9 – 11.



Key Stage 4

During Years 9 - 11 students continue to study the Core Subjects alongside their choice of options subjects. Students also continue with physical education and progress in citizenship, PSHE/RSE, ICT and RE. Students also engage in our Business Enterprise Programme which aims to develop personal skills and provide a taste of how to set up and run a business in partnership with other people. The programme is judged by local business owners and students relish the challenge and opportunities it provides.

Our students achieve great success at key stage 4 enabling them to transition successfully to a wide range of pathways at Post 16 level allowing them to achieve their aspirations.



Key Stage 5

One of the wonderful aspects of attending an 11 – 19 school is the opportunity to attend the Sixth Form where you are taught by specialists who know you, your strengths and areas in which you are less confident. The curriculum is, at this stage, narrowed as student interest and aspirations really begin to focus on careers they may wish to pursue. The mixture of A Level, vocational and technical qualifications is expansive and enables our students to attain really successful outcomes whilst working in an environment in which they are known personally. There are courses available for students of all abilities which are led by highly specialised staff.

Careers Advice

Careers education with especially-trained staff forms part of the PSHE course for all students from Year 7 to Year 13. This is supported by Next Steps SW, visiting speakers and individual discussions with advisers who regularly attend Parents' Evenings. Students are supported by specialist staff who create opportunities to raise aspirations through partnerships with Future First and returning Alumni.

Sixth Form students can choose to sign up to the William Clift Academy where they will be mentored to support them in achieving their chosen career, whilst younger students can access opportunities through our Emerging William Clift and William Hamley Academies.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Bodmin College runs many activities outside the scope of the normal timetable encouraging a large proportion of students to participate. The sporting life of the College is very active and many inter-school competitions are played in a wide variety of sports. Girls and boys represent Cornwall in many County Teams and students from Bodmin College regularly win County, Regional and, on occasion, National recognition.

Musical and drama pursuits are encouraged, with Bodmin College musical renowned throughout the region. Recent productions have involved working with top West End stars, including some of our own alumni. A large number of students and members of the community - including students from primary schools, former students and even parents, get the opportunity for life-changing experiences.

Numerous visits are made throughout the year to places of educational and cultural interest - museums, theatres, galleries and exhibitions. Field trips to support geographical and scientific subjects are conducted both in and out of Cornwall.

The College is a participant in Erasmus+, a Lifelong Learning Programme organised by the European Commission. Erasmus+ supports cooperative international activities in education, training, youth and sport. Under the scheme, Bodmin College is linked with schools in Bad Bederkesa, Le Relecq and the Telde School on Gran Canaria.

There are also opportunities for students to participate in regular recreational and fun activities.

Your children will have the opportunity to be involved in community service activities - helping local nurseries and primary schools. They may also choose to take part in the Duke of Edinburgh's Award or try public speaking. We train teams annually to participate in the famous Ten Tors expedition on Dartmoor. The Summer Year 7 Camp at Porthpean is an event all look forward to as is the opportunity to go skiing or to Thorpe Park, Disneyland Paris, Spain and/or Italy as well as Eco School trips and event.

As well as these opportunities, every year our students organise and take part in a number of fundraising activities in which we raise several thousand pounds for national and local charities.

Whilst joining in with these activities is optional, they do provide an invaluable opportunity for students to pursue their interests and establish relationships outside of the classroom with other students.





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STUDENTS

In non-Covid circumstances Year 6 students will spend at least a day at Bodmin College meeting staff and students as they take part in a range of enjoyable lessons and activities during the summer term. Families are also invited to attend an introductory evening and can, of course, make an appointment to see us at other times should there be any concerns or questions. This year a comprehensive virtual experience replaced this, coupled with additional induction days in September where Year 7 students joined their friends and the other students in a tutor group, linked to one of four houses, Dunmere, Glynn, Helman or Beacon.

During Years 7 and 8 students will try new activities and learn many new things in a wide range of subjects. At the end of Year 7 a threeday residential camp at Porthpean and, in Year 8, the prospect of going to Paris, makes Key Stage 3 very exciting. Towards Easter of Year 8 students make option choices for Year 9. We have a varied range of subjects on offer and encourage students to opt for those subjects in which they have specific talents and/or interest.

In Years 9 – 11 work begins on chosen option subjects and students start preparing for examination and controlled assessment tasks. The staff will offer help and support throughout, ensuring that students have every chance of reaching their potential. As Year 11 draws to a close students start to consider their options about further education. The vast majority of young people at Bodmin College choose to stay on in our Sixth Form due to the wide range of courses and the personal support we are able to provide. After the rigours of the summer examinations the opportunity to attend a Year 11 graduation assembly and the Year 11 Prom is welcomed by all. achievement and something students are extremely proud of. Life in the Sixth Form is very different from Key Stages 3 and 4 with no school uniform and a more adult approach to education being expected. The exciting curriculum and range of opportunities is supported by high quality teaching by specialists, fantastic individual support and wonderful high quality facilities.

The Common Room, 6th Form Study Centre and Crate Café offer students a place to both study and relax in a supportive environment. Once completing study in the Sixth Form, Bodmin College are pleased to offer a two year Foundation Degree in Digital Media. This course is run in conjunction with Falmouth University and has become an incredibly popular choice for our students and others within the locality. Studying for a third year at Falmouth completes a BA (Hons).

Throughout the journey through Bodmin College students will be presented with a wide and diverse range of activities in which they can participate. There is something for everyone at Bodmin College; from being part of the Student Council to training for the Ten Tors expedition on Dartmoor, from dance or the drama studio Technical Club to running a business, from a wide range of sports to playing in the Jazz Orchestra.

We all really hope you get some great results and enjoy life at Bodmin College; it is a fantastic place with fantastic people dedicated to helping you be successful.

HOMEWORK

At Bodmin College we set homework tasks for all our students because research shows that this develops independent study skills, and revisiting a topic improves learning. Students who regularly complete homework tasks are generally more successful in examinations.

Students are free to use the computers, printers and staff support in classrooms which are open every lunchtime to support homework. Should a student forget to complete a homework task they will be expected to catch-up the work in a compulsory session after school. We have moved to an online method for recording, tracking and monitoring homework, that allows both parents and students to see the details of the tasks that have been set, deadlines, submission status and grades; this can be done via

We hope that this service will provide parents with a deeper insight into the homework their child receives. More importantly, we hope that it will improve the student's organisation, timemanagement and help them to keep on top of their workload. Should your child be absent for any reason they will also find daily remote learning provision that they can refer to at any time.



COLLEGE FOOD

Aspens is the company chosen to provide the meal service. They specialise in providing catering to schools and colleges across the country. As the food children eat at school plays an important role in their wellbeing, eating a well-balanced diet will not only maintain and improve their health, but will also set them on the right track for later life. Aspen's understand this and that's why they are passionate about serving fresh, high quality and locally sourced food that is cooked in our kitchen. They have a fantastic range to choose from and ensure that the variety of food that children like and want to eat is available. All of the dishes are prepared daily using quality, fresh, and responsibly sourced seasonal ingredients. Aspen's are able to cater for special diets.

Bodmin College runs a cashless system whereby students use their thumbprint to pay for their meals. Students' accounts can be topped up online, at PayPoint machines in shops or using payment machines in College. Parents can set the amount that their child is able to spend each day whilst the system will also highlight if a child attempts to purchase food to which they are allergic. 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STUDENT HEALTH

Now, more than ever, student health is paramount. Our Covid-protection measures have been implemented in conjunction with parent, student and staff feedback and Government guidance (find full details on our website). Please tell us important medical information about your child so that any problems can be dealt with in the best way e.g. if they have diabetes, asthma or an allergy.

In case of accident or illness at school we will always try to take such action as would reasonably be taken by parents, who will be informed as soon as possible. For this reason we employ a full-time trained first-aider dedicated to our students' emergency and longer term health needs; we also have a number of school counsellors. In addition, our Pastoral Support Worker liaises with external agencies as needed.

DISCIPLINE

We hope that we share with you expectations about student attitude, behaviour and work. We would like you to join in praising your child's successes, and we would ask for your support if sanctions are necessary.

Those students who observe the simple set of rules, needed for us to function effectively, are praised and rewarded. The opposite results in sanctions ranging from removal of privileges to detentions, internal isolation and fixed term exclusion. All students are expected to adhere to the rules and be kind, be polite, be honest and work to the very best of their ability allowing teachers to teach and students to learn.

PUNCTUALITY AND ATTENDANCE

Punctuality is a courtesy that is encouraged and students receive special certificates each term for 100% attendance and punctuality. Conversely, repeated lateness will result in sanctions. If your child is ill and cannot attend College then please let us know on the first day of their absence. If an absence is likely to be prolonged then you are encouraged to contact the College so we can start to arrange for work to be sent home to help keep your child up to date.

GCSE

6TH FORM

For another year running, our Sixth Form celebrates fantastic A-Level results with students achieved an outstanding 100% pass rate across A-Level, Technical and Vocational qualifications despite a challenging two years of study. Despite the unprecedented challenges of the school year, all students secured exciting future pathways including:

Rosa Woods who is going on to study a degree in Natural Sciences at Cambridge University after gaining five A* grades in Chemistry, Physics, Maths, Further Maths, and Drama. Rosa commented, "I'm elated! I can't believe I've gained five A*s! The staff here at Bodmin College 6th form have been phenomenal and so supportive. I'm absolutely delighted!"

Liam Lethbridge also recorded exceptional grades, achieving A* grades in Maths, Further Maths, Physics and Computer Science. He will go on to study a joint honours degree in Computer Science and Mathematics, with a placement year at Bath University. He commented, "The staff have been so supportive. Being experts in their field, they've really helped me gain the grades I've received today and I couldn't be more grateful."

Maya KC Cotton, will progress onto Arts Ed Drama School after a successful audition in the summer term. She achieved an A* in Drama and an A in English Language, alongside Distinction* in Dance. The support from the VI Form team has been amazing, and the Creative teaching team have been so inspirational and dedicated to helping their students reach their goals." Harry will now progress to Coventry University to study Cloud Computing whilst Jack is looking forward to joining the Fire Service.

Mia Rowe achieved A* grades in Drama, English Literature and Psychology. She intends to take a gap year in order to prepare for auditions that will support her aspirations towards a career in acting and performance.

Emily Livsey achieved A* grades in Art and Fine Art as well as gaining a Double Distinction* in Textiles. She is going on to study Textiles Design at Leeds Arts University.

Abi Hill and Tia Rawlings both achieved Triple Distinction* in Health and Social Care and have successfully secured places to study Nursing at Bristol UWE and Plymouth University respectively.

Jack Mackenzie and Jowan Rawson both celebrate sporting successes with Double Distinction* and Distinction* in BTEC Sport respectively. Both have secured scholarship places in the United States in Ohio's Mount Vernon Nazarene University and West Virginia's University of Charleston.
