If you have any concerns regarding the safety of a child please ensure you report it to a member of the Safeguarding Team 01208 72114.

If your concern is of immediate harm or outside of school hours, please report to the Police or MASSH 0300 1231 116.

Remember



It does not matter if you are a paid worker, a volunteer or a member of the community, you have a responsibility to act if you are worried about a child.



Each agency will have someone who has a responsibility for child protection and safeguarding issues - they have had the training to know what to do next.



It is not your responsibility to investigate child abuse but you must tell the appropriate person within the school.

Your responsibility for safeguarding

No one wants to hear about children being abused, neglected or unsafe and that sometimes makes it difficult to respond.

Remember these important messages:

- all children have a right to be safe, no matter who they are or what their circumstances.
- Keeping children safe is everyone's responsibility.
- We all need to listen to children even though we may not always be comfortable with what we hear.

Children can be abused physically, sexually, emotionally or through neglect. The concerns that you have may make up part of a bigger picture which could help to prevent serious harm to a child. Giving families help at an early stage can prevent abuse and neglect.
